For March's Parks & Recreation Directors Report, I have the following to offer. Preparation for our spring sports has begun as our public works start trying to get the fields ready for use after a late breaking winter. We are requesting a little patience as we are doing our best to get our fields ready. The summer concert schedule has been finalized and this year we will host 8 summer concerts including a concert on July 2nd which we will honor America and our veterans, especially those from the greatest generation – World War II. The concert will feature the Manhattan Dolls who will perform their show called "A sentimental journey" that will take us through the great music of the 30's and 40's. They perform this concert in full costume in true USO fashion so we hope everyone will spend this special day with us. Other summer concert acts will be a children's concert, the chs alumni band, a country act, a beatle's tribute band, a classic rock n roll group, an 80's and 90's rock n band and we will also be hosting philly's #1 wedding, rb, motown and dance band, Bigg Romeo. Public Works – Mr. Young

Good evening - From Public Works, we have the following to report; We are making our first pass of the season through the town for collection of accumulated brush. This is a brush only trip with leaf collection scheduled for next month. Remember that leaves will only be collected until the end of April. Leaves and brush must be separated. Please do not comingle brush and leaf materials as will prevent us from picking your material up when we pass through. The annual schedules for all recycling, including brush and leaves should be arriving at your house within the next few weeks. Until such time as they arrive, follow last year's schedule and allow for the one day differential. Speaking to schedules, please pay attention to the County Recycling Schedule when it arrives as well. You will note on weeks with a Monday holiday, the recycling is one day later than trash pick up. Please remember, we did not create these regulations, however, we are tasked with enforcement. Please do

not abuse our staff who are only trying to do the job that they obligated to perform. We continue to do pothole repairs, however, due to the cold weather the plants have not opened so we can only get cold patch for temporary repairs. This is a costly activity because we are forced to make the same repair twice. We have been advised if the weather stays in the mid to upper 40's the plants will be open within the week.
