5. **Cinnaminson Township Launches "GOV Pilot" Online Government Management Platform.** The purpose of the platform is to improve service

productivity and resident engagement. There are new links on the bottom of the front page of the Township's web site at [www.cinnaminsonnj.org](http://www.cinnaminsonnj.org), including links for downloading the application to Android devices and Apple devices. Once downloaded, users will be able to report concerns through their devices directly to the appropriate Township official. The program is preloaded with various options and also enables users to provide an additional description of the concern. The new applications also enable residents to request public documents and apply for use of municipal facilities and parks. The GOV Pilot application will assist the Township with continuing to provide outstanding local municipal services to Cinnaminson Township residents. 10. **Property Tax Reimbursement Program.** Cinnaminson residents ages 67 or older and receiving Social Security disability benefits may be eligible for the State of New Jersey's Property Tax Reimbursement Program (PTR). 11. **Cinnaminson Township Utilizes *Nixle Engage Communications System*** to expedite immediate text messages to **registered** cell phones and email addresses in an effort to notify residents and businesses of emergency announcements and community updates. The Nixle Engage communications tool assists the Township in notifying large numbers of people in real time concerning important issues. Residents are encouraged to register for the notifications by **texting "08077" to the number 888777** from their cell phone. Residents also can register online at [www.nixle.com](http://www.nixle.com) to receive the notifications via email and/or mobile phone. Please note that regardless of your zip code, you must register under the zip code **08077** to receive Nixle alerts concerning Cinnaminson Township.
12. **September is Library Card Sign-up Month!** Your library card gives you access to books, DVDs, magazines, video games and more. No time to stop by the library? You can access e-books, stream movies and borrow museum passes through the library website with your card. Library staff will be at Cinnaminson Day on September 29<sup>th</sup>. Stop by the table to register for a card and learn about all the things the library offers. 13. **Reporting Non-Emergency Incidents.** Residents are reminded to call Police Department communications at (856) 829-6666 for non-emergency incidents. An officer will be quickly dispatched to provide a response.
14. **Burlington County Shredding and Recycling Events will be Held on Three (3) Sundays (September 8, October 20 and November 17) from 9:00am to 1:00pm**, rain or shine, at the **Burlington County Resource Recovery Complex**, located at 22000 Burlington-Columbus Road in Florence Township. No eWASTE can be brought to this event. Bring only "confidential" documents such as bank and credit card statements, tax returns and papers with account numbers. No binders, plastic folders, computer disks or credit cards will be accepted. Up to four bags or boxes per car will be accepted. Previously shredded paper can also be recycled at this event. Burlington County staff will unload cars. Proof of Burlington County residency required.
